EARLY LEARNING INTERVENTIONS

Did You Know?

The Jordan Public School believes that early education and interventions are the foundation of all learning.

Along with our *Parent Aware Rated* preschool and ECFE

programs, we also offer early intervention services

to families with children birth to Kindergarten, ensuring even our youngest are reaching their milestones and receive help **when extra help is needed.**

Birth to 3 Intervention

Our Early Intervention staff will provide a system of services that help babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Based on the family needs and priorities, the school staff will help the family problem solve and give information and ideas of activities they can do to enhance play and daily routines. They also help to connect families with community resources and supports as needed.

Age 3–6 Intervention

The Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) Preschool

Program provides learning experiences in all areas of development including social, self help, motor, communication, and cognitive skills. Children who have been identified with a developmental delay can benefit from many types of services within the ECSE classroom including speech, occupational, physical and vision therapies and assistive technology. ECSE services can also be provided in an inclusive setting within the regular preschool program offered in our Elementary School (Early Explorers Preschool).

Preschool Screening

Has your three year old been screened?

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance.



Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance. The earlier the better! Early Childhood Screening is not a Kindergarten readiness test or IQ test. Waiting until your child is 4 or 5 to screen may be too long.



This year, the combine will be hosted by the entire Hubmen High School Football Program. This will offer each athlete a great opportunity to work with the Hubmen athletes as they



SCHOOL DISTRICT PROJECT UPDATES



- The east set of 4 tennis courts on the north side of the middle school received a complete makeover. The old asphalt was removed and new asphalt was poured and painted, trees were cut on the west side to eliminate the invasion of their roots in the courts, new fencing was installed, new poles and nets were installed, and finally new light fixtures were installed to allow all 4 courts to be lit up at night.
- Installation of new doors and locking mechanisms at the stadium is occurring.
- The complete wireless system is being rebuilt, with new wireless access points being installed in all buildings.
- The CERC multi-purpose room is getting a ceiling camera installed and a system that will allow for school board meetings to be broadcast live in real time.
- An access card reader is being added to the northwest corner of the middle school adjacent to the tennis courts.
- Electric pull downs are being added to the 5th and 6th grade "Einstein Lab" to make this space versatile and conducive to project based learning.
- Parking lot cracks will be filled and sealed, and the lot stripes are being repainted.


- The media center received a major furniture upgrade at the end of this past spring and during this summer. The furniture is much more "kid centered" and is collaborative and much more conducive to project based learning.
- The cafeteria will have new tile installed along the south wall and the entire cafeteria space is getting a fresh coat of paint.
- The parking lot cracks are being filled and sealed and all of the lines will be repainted.
- **MENTARY SCHOO** Note that we're moving the ECFE parent drop-off and pick-up to the back of the building. Parents and quardians will be receiving more information about this change to promote a safer way to bring our early learners to school from Mrs. Barnett prior to the start of the school year.
- Ceiling tile replacement throughout the building continues to occur, building upon the work that has been done the past three summers.
- Three of our first grade classrooms, the main entry, and the office will have new carpet installed to match the carpet installed in the hallway along the kindergarten and 1st grade wing last summer.



- All new door hardware/locks are being installed throughout the building.
- classrooms and students.

SCHOOL DISTRICT PROJECT UPDATES

- New HVAC controls are being installed as phase two of a multi-phase conversion in the entire HVAC system.
- Auditorium upgrades such as new light fixtures and a new cyclorama are being installed.
- New student centered spaces are being created with the remaking of the lecture room, classroom adjacent to the lecture room, and a lab space within the media center.
- IGH SCHOO A writable pivot wall is being installed on the south side of the media center, a garage door was installed in the classroom adjacent to the lecture room and media center, and new flexible, project based furniture has been ordered for these spaces. Additionally, new lighting is being installed in some of these spaces and a fresh coat of paint is being applied.
- The gym ceiling and walls were cleaned and painted this summer. As part of our mascot rebranding process, the refreshed gym walls will get new logos over the next several years.



- Parking lot cracks will be filled and sealed, and the lot stripes are being repainted.
- A new set of Chromebooks for students in grades 10-12 will be deployed replacing the set purchased 3 years ago.

- The district is working with DLR Group to synthesize the work done, and input given during the long range facility planning process that occurred over the 2017-2018 school year with school and community committee members. We'll be working cooperatively to put the plan on paper that incorporates the components which most effectively incorporates the pieces of the conversations to date.
 - This plan will then be shared with the committee and then with the board between July 31st and November 1st of 2018. After that time, the district will publish this future facility plan so the community will be able to view it. While the district has no definitive plans on when the next phase of school site development will occur, it has taken steps to plan for the future.





 A 40 acre parcel was purchased several years ago, the district submitted for annexation of this parcel into the City of Jordan during the spring/summer of 2018, and has had a series of work sessions and conversations with stakeholders to plan for the future. Additionally, a recent demographer's study was completed to help the district plan for future enrollment trends.



SCHOOL DISTRICT THE LATEST

Nutritional Services Welcomes students back to school! This year we have improved many areas of our program and will continue to do so all year long. We have been **fortunate to have received three grants for the Midwest Dairy Council** that has allowed us to provide fresh made smoothies and a Second Chance Breakfast option at our high school in the past. This year we have been given a grant to improve our breakfast program at our elementary school. We will be receiving a kiosk and extra milk coolers to implement breakfast in different

areas of the school along with a new hot holding cabinet for use in our kitchen. The grants we receive are very important in being able to provide new initiatives for our program.

New this year is a **two week gluten free cycle menu for all students that are diagnosed with celiac disease** and are not able to eat any foods that contain gluten. This menu will be specific to the needs of students that cannot eat gluten and will provide them with a variety of nutritious, gluten free foods. We also have a gluten free policy in place to help provide guidelines for parents and what the school district can and cannot provide. Please contact your student's school nurse or myself if you have any further questions.

Last spring we introduced a new coffee option at our high school. Jordan Java is now being served in our snack room! We serve two flavors of coffee each day and a variety of fat free flavored creamers that students can add to personalize their java. We have also **added new menu items**; Turkey Pot Pie, Burritos, Pasta dishes, and Rice Bowls just to name a few. Look for more new entrees this coming year! We look forward to seeing all of you in our cafeterias this coming school year! — Andrea Schaak, Nutritional Services Director

Over the past several months we've had one large group **Foundation Formation** Meeting where we invited in representatives from the New Prague and Mahtomedi Education Foundations. After this step, an "Executive Committee" was formed to do the important start-up work necessary to get the foundation moving forward. Our Foundation Formation Executive Committee has worked hard to develop draft bylaws and mission and vision statements. In addition, the team has worked to establish a PO Box,

tax ID number, and take care of other business associated with start-up of the foundation. Late this summer a board of directors and officers will be elected. The foundation will exist to fundraise to provide student scholarships and mini classroom grants to teachers. The late Jiv Pauly provided funds for a variety of projects and upgrades at Jordan Public Schools. A large sum of money remains and will serve as "seed money" for the newly formed Jordan Education Foundation. Look for more information about potential "kick-off" events and other ways you can be involved with the foundation in the near future via the Jordan Journalist, social media, the district's website, and the Jordan Independent.

SCHOOL DISTRICT THE LATEST

The Special Service Department is excited for the upcoming 2018-2019 school year! The Special Services Department continues to work and update curricular resources and supports throughout the district. The elementary school special education department just purchased a new math resource that meets the needs of our students in grades K-4. Along with our special education department, our English Language staff is also purchasing updated curricular resources to meet our English Language Learners needs in grades K-12. The Jordan Special Education Advisory Council or SEAC would like to invite parents of students with special needs to participate in the 2018-2019 SEAC meetings. SEAC usually meets three to four times during the school year. In addition to SEAC, the Jordan American Indian Parent Advisory Council or AIPAC would also like to invite parents of students who are identified as Native American Indian to participate in the 2018-2019 AIEC meetings. This council usually meets three to four times during the school year. Back-to-School Conferences/ Curriculum Event, Grades 1-4

Before school starts in the fall, all students and families in grades 1-4 will meet individually with their teacher to drop off school supplies, discuss grade levels expectations and curriculum, pay for lunches, turn in paperwork, and be assessed in reading. Kindergarten families will have a separate event during the evening on September 6 (see Kick Start to Kindergarten article on page 51).

The JES Back to School Conferences/Curriculum days will be held on Tuesday, September 4 from 12pm-7:30pm and Wednesday, September 5 from 9am-4:30pm. Students and families will meet with their homeroom teacher for approximately 30 minutes (15 minutes to in the

classroom with teacher and 15 minutes for a reading assessment. Afterwards, students and families will have the opportunity to travel around the building checking in with our specialist teachers (Music, Art, Phy.Ed. and Media/Tech), SPED and support staff, school nurses, or office and lunchroom staff. **Please remember that in order for students to be enrolled at JES, we need to have a birth certificate and proof of immunizations or a conscientious objection form on file.** Students <u>will not</u> get their picture taken during this time; instead they will be taken during the school day on September 27th.

JES families will receive a letter in mid August about the Back to School Conference Days and who your child's teacher is for the fall. The letter will contain information on how to sign-up online for a conference time on either September 4th or 5th. Standards Based Project Based Learning (PBL) Opportunities: Project Based Learning is an instructional practice where students gain an understanding of content standards through a time of extended investigation and response to authentic, engaging and complex questions. This approach allows students to gain an accurate understanding of the skills needed for success not only in college but life. At Jordan Middle School, we look forward to staff adding PBL to their best practice techniques which will allow students to demonstrate their knowledge of the content through multiple avenues.

Positive Behavioral Intervention and Support (PBIS): Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) is a process for creating school environments that are more predictable and effective for achieving academic and social goals. Expectations are taught in a proactive manner with the goal of preventing behaviors. In many places, the majority of students follow the school's expectations, but are never acknowledged for their positive behavior. Through instruction, comprehension and regular practice, all stakeholders use a consistent set of posted behavior expectations and rules. When some students do not respond to teaching of the behavioral rules, JMS staff view it as an opportunity for re-teaching, not punishment. We look forward to recognizing our students for displaying J-Town P.R.I.D.E this school year!

Flexible/Collaborative Spaces and PLANIT JORDAN: We continue to utilizate the flexible and collaborative spaces at Jordan Middle School. The middle school is an amazing building, providing the space for students to develop 21st century skills needed in our world today. As wonderful as the building is, it is the people walking the halls that make JMS great. Jordan Middle School is blessed with wonderful students, remarkable families, exceptional staff, and a committed community. HIGH SCHOOL

Jordan Community, Families, and Students,

The staff at Jordan High School looks forward to welcoming our students for the 2018-2019 school year. We have been working hard over the summer to prepare the building, create and revise curriculum, and update supplies. We all strive to provide an education that prepares our graduates for the 21st century. Jordan High School is a small school that offers big opportunities for our students.



We are **excited to host our third year of Freshman FOCUS**, to assist in the transition for our newest students to the high school. **All 9th grade students will report to school on Tuesday, September 4th.** We will take the students through an orientation, community building, and walk through their schedule. We find this to be a great day to ease the nerves of students new to JHS. On the same day, **September 4th, our 10th-12th grade students will "Go Remote"** and will be responsible for checking in online with their teachers and completing assignments remotely. See more on page 57.

Teachers will again be using **Schoology**, **a learning management system**, that will help students organize their calendars and keep track of assignments. Parents will have access to their students' account and will be able to see what students see when they go into Schoology. Teachers will organize the sites by courses that include folders for each unit. These folders may include presentations, links, videos, assignments and/or quizzes to be completed digitally, curriculum information, the class syllabus with classroom expectations, and other information. Parents will also be able to access a calendar with assignment due dates and test dates. Schoology will help prepare students who choose to attend a two or four year college where learning management systems are common.

During the past four school years, **students have become accustomed to working with Google docs and saving their assignments to the Cloud**. This allows students to collaborate with each other and their teachers simultaneously. They can access their documents using their Chromebooks or any other device, including their phones, from any location. Storing work on the Cloud means students will never lose their assignments or forget them at home; they can easily retrieve them from home and school. Finally, teachers can respond to student work more quickly as well.

The 2018-19 Registration Handbook also includes a few new classes. We added many interdisciplinary (course that employs more than one subject area) classes. We added another "capstone" class that will involve interdisciplinary study, concurrent college credit, and hands on learning opportunities. The new following classes will be offered:

• Senior Seminar / Healthcare and Medicine / Multicultural Education and Human Relations in Schools — Students have the opportunity to take professional studies course that combine cross-curricular and real world learning (learn more on page 57).

The beginning of the school year is always exciting. The list above will provide your sons and daughters with the information they need to be successful.

We encourage our students to take their education seriously and begin to decide who they want to be and how they are going to get there.

Senior Seminar — **Leaning Life Hacks to Independent Living** This course is designed to help students develop skills they will use throughout their lives. In this course students will spend 6 weeks in three elective areas of Industrial Technology, Family and Consumer Science and financial planning. Students will have the opportunity to develop independent living skills through an interdisciplinary approach utilizing resources in Business, FACS, and Industrial Technology.

Healthcare and Medicine The Healthcare and Medicine program fully immerses students in St. Francis Regional Medical Center and St. Gertrude's providing unprecedented access to real world experiences in the dynamic field of healthcare and medicine. Partnering with experienced medical professionals, students will advance their understanding of healthcare systems, communications, legal issues, medical terminology, patient care, professionalism, ethics, and explore many career opportunities in healthcare. This course requires students to be active, independent learners and fosters empowerment, self-discovery, collaboration, and critical thinking skills. Students will engage in a variety of opportunities including case studies, problem and project-based learning, and tours. Chromebooks not received during these two dates, will be distributed in the first week of school once all parent paperwork is received (all outstanding fees must be paid in advance as well).

Parking Permits

Permits are \$100 for the year, if purchased on or before August 29th and the Parking Permit form must be completed. On August 30th, the fee will increase to \$125. Please purchase your permit early! Freshmen and new students will be assigned a locker and lock for the school year. They will be expected to return the lock at the end of the year. 

Reservation of Lagoon/Lion's Park Facilities

Lagoon Park has five shelters (two large, one small, a gazebo, and an enclosed shelter) available for reservation. Individuals/groups are only able to reserve park shelters, not the use of the entire park. Reservations are made through Community Ed.

Permit cost is \$50 per shelter for Jordan residents, \$75 for non-residents; and no charge for non-profit organizations. There is also a \$150 per shelter refundable deposit required at time of reservation for all parties. You must bag trash and you may leave it at the shelter.

Events over 100 people or including alcoholic beverages must obtain a special event permit from the City of Jordan at 952-492-2535. Shelter reservations through Community Ed. are still required.
