EARLY LEARNING INTERVENTIONS

Jordan Public Schools believes that early education and interventions are the foundation of all learning. Along with our *Parent Aware Rated* preschool and ECFE programs, **we also offer early intervention services to families with children birth to Kindergarten**, ensuring even our youngest are reaching their milestones and receive help **when extra help is needed**.

Birth to 3 Intervention

Our Early Intervention staff will provide a system of services that help babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Based on the family needs and priorities, the school staff will help the family problem solve and give information and ideas of activities they can do to enhance play and daily routines. They also help to connect families with community resources and supports as needed.

Age 3–6 Intervention

The Early Childhood Special **Education (ECSE) Preschool Program** provides learning experiences in all areas of development including social, self help, motor, communication, and cognitive skills. Children who have been identified with a developmental delay can benefit from many types of services within the ECSE classroom including speech, occupational, physical and vision therapies and assistive technology. ECSE services can also be provided in an inclusive setting within the regular preschool program offered in our Elementary School (Early Explorers Preschool). For more call (952) 492-4285.

Preschool Screening

Has your three year old been screened?

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance.



ECFE classes are held in the Jordan Early Learning Services wing at the Jordan Elementary School. The classrooms are located in the south-west corner of the building. Park on the south-west side, and enter through the main doors, turning right after entering the building.

A \$20.00 administrative fee will be charged for withdrawing from a class. Refunds for classes or special events must be requested 5 working days prior to the start of class or event. No refunds will be granted after this date. Please register at least one week prior to the start of class or special event.

- Phone registrations will be guaranteed only after payment has been received.
- Please notify our office of cancellations at least 3 working days prior to first class meeting in order to receive a refund. No refunds are given for missed classes. No refunds on either special events or classes will be given after registration deadlines unless an event has been cancelled. A \$20.00 administrative fee REMINDERS will be charged for withdrawing from a class.
 - Classes are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. In order to hold a class, a minimum of five families must be registered. You ARE registered unless notified otherwise.
 - Jordan ELS requires all students to have a current birth certificate, immunizations, photo release, and state enrollment forms on record. These forms must be on record before the second class in a series.

Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance. The earlier the better! Early Childhood Screening is not a Kindergarten readiness test or IQ test. Waiting until your child is 4 or 5 to screen may be too long.



NUTRITIONAL SERVICES Jordan Nutritional Services is very excited to welcome back all of our students this fall! This coming year, the USDA has issued a waiver that provides **free breakfast and lunch for all students starting this fall through June 30th, 2022**! We are very happy the USDA is again providing free meals for our students this coming school year. We are also hopeful that we can again offer salad bars and second hot options to our students when we begin back in August.

New at Jordan High school is a Grab and Go Hot Entree option that will be offered everyday. This includes student favorites such as hamburgers, chicken patties, pizza, hot dogs, etc. as a second option to our daily hot meal choice.

At Jordan Middle school we will add back our Full Salad bar option for students and a different hot entree option on Tuesdays and Thursdays. At our Elementary school we are also exploring a second lunch option each day for students. We have done "Kidsables" in the past and are now exploring how we can make that option even better, so stay tuned!



We are all very excited to be bringing our meal options back for students to enjoy this coming school year!

TEACHING AND LEARNING The 2020-2021 school year was a year unlike any other. Families, students, and staff have worked through hybrid, distance, and in-person learning schedules compounded with quarantines, changing guidance, and shifting academic models. Although the past school year brought endless change to the traditional educational model, what did not change was the district's dedication to connecting with and supporting our students, especially during challenging times.

With all these changes, the past school year was a time to **Transform and Reimagine** education. Consequently, the primary focus of professional development was giving all staff the **TOOLS** and **TIME** needed to flip an educational model, support curriculum needs, and learn new strategies all aimed at meeting the needs of students in a virtual and on-site setting. However at the same time, it was also important to bridge goals, work, and planning pre-COVID with what the future of education looks like now. As a district, we have focused on project and inquiry based learning to offer students opportunities to connect their classroom learning environments to personal passions through experiential learning. Aligning a 21st century curriculum focused on helping students connect classroom life to the world around them developing critical thinking, creativity, collaboration, and communication while adhering to the standards was also a priority. If education during COVID has taught us anything, it is to keep pushing and reinventing "traditional" classroom life to meet the evolving needs of our students.

Looking ahead to this school year, it is important to take what we have all learned through these constantly changing and sometimes challenging COVID years into consideration as this growth will influence how education looks in the future. Restructuring time, continuing a focus on student-centered learning models, reimagining the educator's role in the classroom, supporting curriculum resources, and understanding a changing school culture are only some of the ways education continues to transform post-COVID. COVID simply reaffirmed that our classrooms must continually focus on helping students connect classroom life to the world around them, develop critical thinking, focus on creativity, support collaboration, and develop strong communication skills. Through standards based instruction as a solid foundation, the district will continue striving to create these innovative learners by offering authentic learning experiences **connecting to life beyond the classroom walls**.

Local SEACs advise school districts on the development of programs and services to meet the special educational needs of children and families. By sharing their unique perspective of what it is like to use these services, parents can help the district to be more effective in hopes that the outcomes for children with disabilities improve. This year our SEAC group met and are looking into ways to provide more opportunities for students to be actively engaged in activities through Community Education. This group is also advocating for more professional development for support staff within the district. The Jordan SEAC typically meets two to three times a year and meets remotely via Zoom. Please <u>DO NOT</u> line up in the loops prior to 2:30pm. Preschool pick up occurs at 2:30pm and we need to keep the back loop open for those families to ensure the safety of our youngest students at JES. We also need to avoid traffic build up on Sunset Blvd for school buses and in-town traffic to drive through in the afternoon.

GRADES 1–4 BACK-TO-SCHOOL *CONFERENCES/ CURRICULUM EVENT*

Please remember that in order for students to be enrolled at JES, we need proof of immunizations or a conscientious objection form on file, and highly recommend families supply a copy of their child's birth certificate. Students <u>will not</u> get their picture taken during this time; instead they will be taken during the school day on Thursday, September 30.

JES families in grades 1-4 will receive a letter in mid August about the Back to School Conference Days and who your child's teacher is for the fall. The letter will contain information on how to sign-up online for a conference time on either August 30 or 31. Kindergarten families will receive a different letter in early August regarding Kick Start and K Back to School Conferences. If you did not receive a letter, are new to the District, or do not have access to our school website to register for these conferences, please contact the JES office at 952-492-2336. **We only have one time slot available for each student to meet with the classroom teacher and complete assessments, so please plan accordingly if you have a dual household.**

The staff at Jordan High School looks forward to welcoming our students for the 2021-2022 school year. We have been working hard over the summer to prepare the building, create and revise curriculum, and update supplies. We all strive to provide an education that prepares our graduates for the 21st century. Jordan High School is a small school that offers big opportunities for our students.



We are excited to host our sixth year of Freshman FOCUS, to assist in the transition for our newest students to the high school. All 9th grade students will report to school on Monday, August 30. We will take the students through an orientation, community building, and walk through their schedule. We find this to be a great day to ease the nerves of students new to JHS. On the same day, August 30, our 10th-12th grade students will "Go Remote" and will be responsible for checking in online with their teachers and completing assignments remotely. See more on page 59.

Teachers will again be using Google Classroom, a learning management system, that will help students organize their calendars and keep track of assignments. Parents will have access to their students' account and will be able to see what students see when they go into Google Classroom. Teachers will organize the sites by courses that include folders for each unit. These folders may include presentations, links, videos, assignments and/or guizzes to be completed digitally, curriculum information, the class syllabus with classroom expectations, and other information. Parents will also be able to access a daily or weekly summary with assignment due dates and test dates. Google Classroom will help prepare students who choose to attend a two or four year college where learning management systems are common.

During the past six school years, students have become accustomed to working with Google docs and saving their assignments to the Cloud. This allows students to collaborate with each other and their teachers simultaneously. They can access their documents using their Chromebooks or any other device, including their phones, from any location. Storing work on the Cloud means students will never lose their assignments or forget them at home; they can easily retrieve them from home and school. Finally, teachers can respond to student work more quickly as well.

The 2021-2022 Registration Handbook also includes a few new classes. We added many interdisciplinary (course that employs more than one subject area) classes over the past few years. We are excited about the continued growth of our Summit Academy courses. This past school year we added a coaching and leadership class that was highly successful in connecting students with the community in sports clinics.

The beginning of the school year is always exciting. We encourage our students to take their education seriously and begin to decide who they want to be and how they are going to get there. As always, the staff at JHS thanks parents for their support and encourages parents to call with questions and concerns.

Mike Harrington Scholarship


