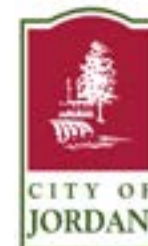


PARKS FACILITY USE AND RENTAL

Jordan Public Schools believes that early education and interventions are the foundation of all learning. Along with our *Parent Aware Rated* preschool and ECFE programs, **we also offer early intervention services to families with children birth to Kindergarten**, ensuring even our youngest are reaching their milestones and receive help *when extra help is needed*.

Birth to 3 Intervention

Our Early Intervention staff will provide a system of services that help babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Based on the family needs and priorities, the school staff will help the family problem solve and give information and ideas of activities they can do to enhance play and daily routines. They also help to connect families with community resources and supports as needed.

Age 3-6 Intervention

The **Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) Preschool Program** provides learning experiences in all areas of development including social, self help, motor, communication, and cognitive skills. Children who have been identified with a developmental delay can benefit from many types of services within the ECSE classroom including speech, occupational, physical and vision therapies and assistive technology. ECSE services can also be provided in an inclusive setting within the regular preschool program offered in our Elementary School (Early Explorers Preschool).

Preschool Screening

Has your three year old been screened?

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance.

Early Childhood Screening

Has your 3 year old been screened? The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance. The earlier the better! Early Childhood Screening is not a Kindergarten readiness test or IQ test. Waiting until your child is 4 or 5 to screen may be too long.

Esperar hasta que su hijo tenga 4 o 5 años para realizar la prueba puede ser demasiado tarde.

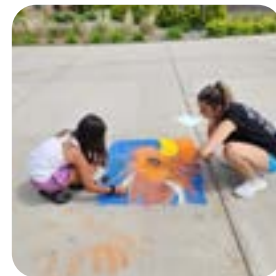

YOUTH DRIVER'S EDUCATION



General Overview:

The Jordan Community Education Driver's Education program is for students, ages 14 1/2 - 18, who live or attend school within Jordan School District 717. The Driver's Education program includes classroom instruction, and behind-the-wheel training. **Must be 14 1/2 years of age by the first day of class to register for Driver's Education.**

Classroom Instruction: 30 hrs

Classroom includes lecture, class discussion, guest speakers, films, written work and written tests. Upon completion, students will be issued a blue card.

Behind-The-Wheel (BTW): 6 hrs

Behind-the-Wheel allows a student to practice driving on public streets and highways with an instructor in a dual control (two brake) car. There is a \$40.00 per hour charge to make up for a missed Behind-the-Wheel. You **MUST** call 952-492-6211 at least 24 hours prior to cancel appointment. Upon completion of behind-the-wheel, students will be issued a white card.

SPRING SESSION:

REFERENDUM PROJECTS UPDATE

The building projects at Jordan Elementary School and Jordan High School started in Spring and Summer 2024. Work is being completed through two phases, with final work being completed in Fall 2025. In Spring and Summer 2024, construction crews were able to complete the Jordan Elementary School 1970s renovation area including 13 classrooms, the media center, art room, RTI rooms, several special education classrooms, restrooms, the back drop off area (first lift), ELS and JES playgrounds, and a roof replacement on the 1970s section of the building. Crews were also

able to complete the seven classroom building addition that wasn't planned to be completed until Spring 2025. At Jordan High School, construction crews were able to complete the new secure entrance and front office space, as well as a full roof replacement. At the same time, the District was able to update the security technology in all exterior doors at Jordan High School.

The JES front office, cafeteria/commons, kitchen, loading dock, and gymnasium building addition opened in February ahead of schedule! We're excited to use this space every day and look forward to sharing this space with our community! Construction work will continue in the building in spaces that have low impact, like the current 1970s JES gym, the music room, the old main office space, and the old cafeteria space. Starting construction on these areas now will allow construction crews more time to complete renovations in the K-1 wing and Jordan Early Learning Services this summer and ensure we're able to start classes on time in the Fall.

With the opening of the new secure entrances at JHS and JES, we have implemented a new process for building visitors at these two locations that includes a visitor background check being completed in the vestibule prior to building entry. We ask that visitors have a valid state-issued ID ready to ensure a quick and smooth entry process. This added security measure will help us ensure our buildings are as safe as possible!

IMPORTANT SUMMER INFORMATION!

Similar to last summer, most of our summer programs will be located at Jordan Middle School, with some camps and programs taking place at Jordan High School. This allows construction crews to close Jordan Elementary School and focus on completing the building construction in an accelerated timeline. During this time, there will be no access for families, staff or students at Jordan Elementary School. As this is an active construction zone, this will also include our playground spaces. We appreciate your understanding of this as we work to keep our community as safe as possible during active construction this summer!

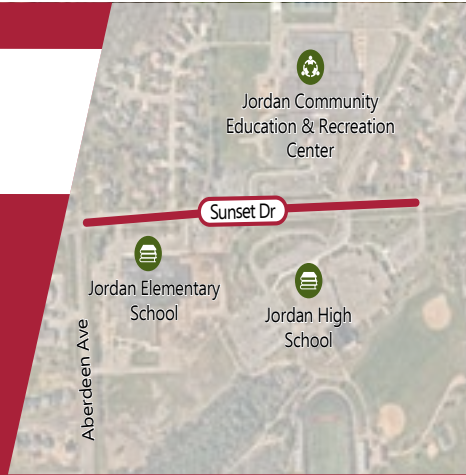

Sunset Drive Improvement Project



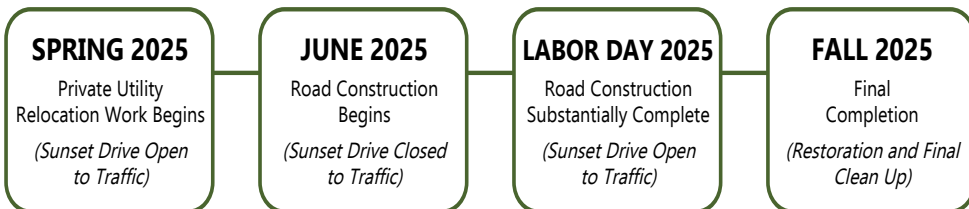
PROJECT BACKGROUND

The City of Jordan and Jordan School District are working together on a project to improve Sunset Drive. A 2019 traffic study completed by the City and School District evaluated existing and future traffic impacts along Sunset Drive, adjacent to the Jordan School's area.

The analysis determined the area is best served by a pair of compact roundabouts along Sunset Drive, coupled with a series of driveway access closures and traffic re-routing within the elementary school site. This layout was the most efficient and safe way identified to move vehicle and pedestrian traffic through the area.

The school district designed their parking lot and pickup/drop-off area improvements to align with the proposed Sunset Drive improvements. Construction is scheduled to occur this summer, beginning in June after the dismissal of school, and will be substantially complete by Labor Day.

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

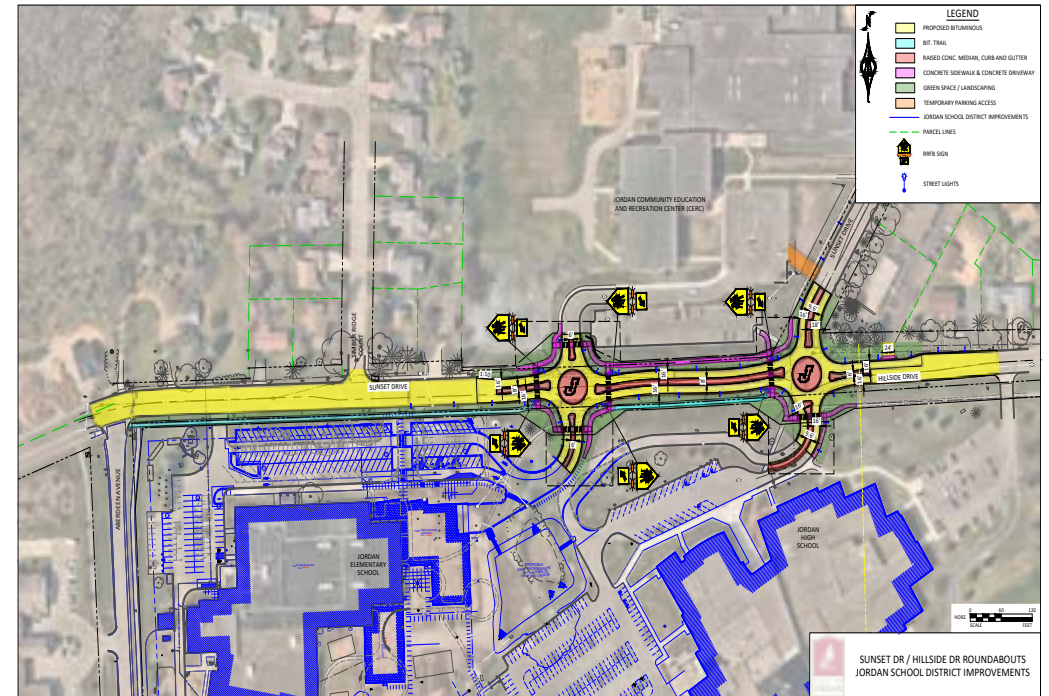

Roundabouts have a 15-20 mph vehicle design speed. Two consecutive roundabouts will help maintain lower speeds.

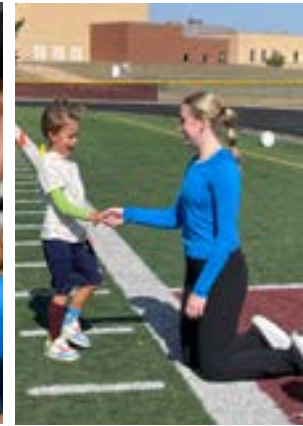

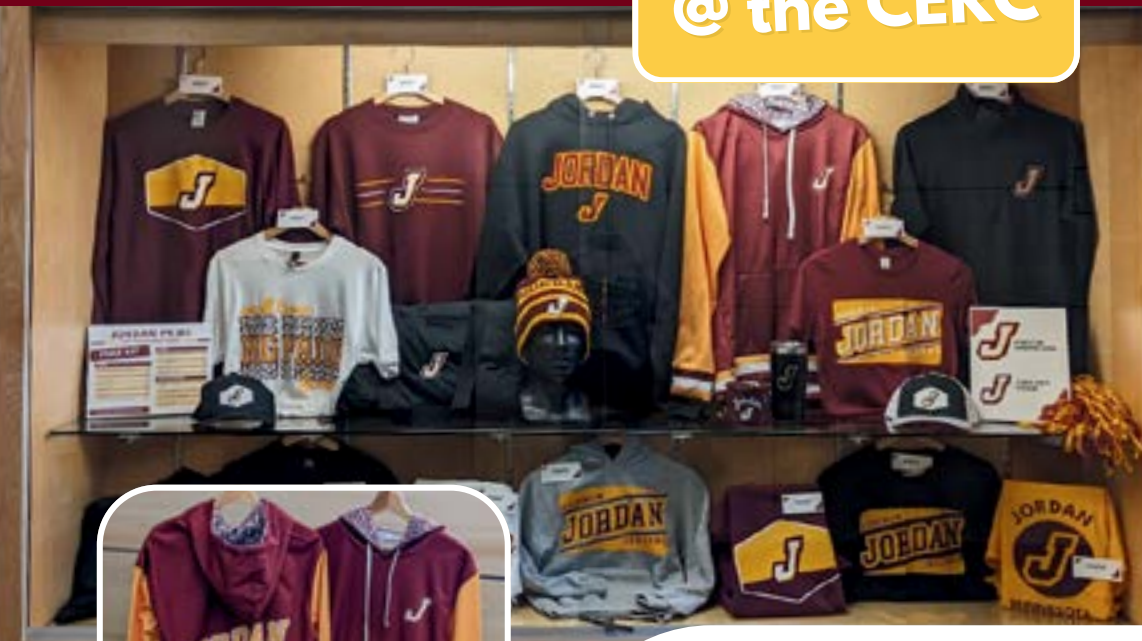

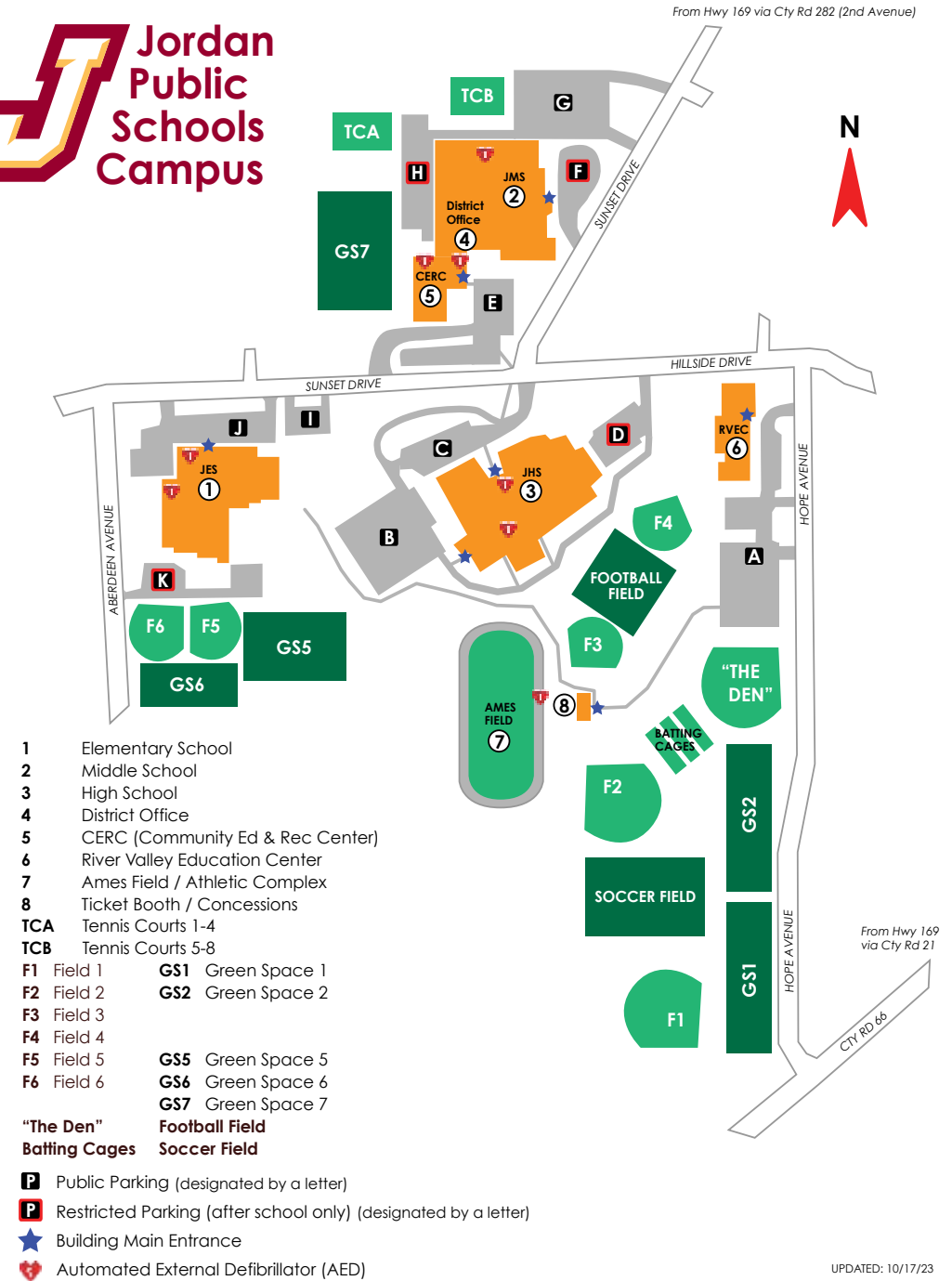
