


PARKS FACILITY USE AND RENTAL



EARLY LEARNING PTO

Jordan Public Schools believes that early education and interventions are the foundation of all learning. Along with our *Parent Aware Rated* preschool and ECFE programs, **we also offer early intervention services to families with children birth to Kindergarten**, ensuring even our youngest are reaching their milestones and receive help **when extra help is needed**.

Birth to 3 Intervention

Our Early Intervention staff will provide a system of services that help babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Based on the family needs and priorities, the school staff will help the family problem solve and give information and ideas of activities they can do to enhance play and daily routines. They also help to connect families with community resources and supports as needed.

Age 3–6 Intervention

The Early Childhood Special **Education (ECSE) Preschool Program** provides learning experiences in all areas of development including social, self help, motor, communication, and cognitive skills. Children who have been identified with a developmental delay can benefit from many types of services within the ECSE classroom including speech, occupational, physical and vision therapies and assistive technology. ECSE services can also be provided in an inclusive setting within the regular preschool program offered in our Elementary School (Early Explorers Preschool). For more call (952) 492-3233.

Preschool Screening

Has your three year old been screened?

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance.





Early Childhood Screening

Has your 3 year old been screened? The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance. The earlier the better! Early Childhood Screening is not a Kindergarten readiness test or IQ test. Waiting until your child is 4 or 5 to screen may be too long.





The main benefits are that a qualified driver in the State of Minnesota is eligible for a 10% discount on their car insurance plus information on safe driving practices, new automobile technology, improvement in our highways that reduces car accident injuries and traffic fatalities. The course offers great tips on defensive driving and reviews the health changes that occur as we age. One major change authorized by the MN State Legislature in 2024 is to eliminate the 8 hour class requirement for ones taking the course for the first time, but maintain taking the 4-hour refresher course every three years.







REFERENDUM PROJECTS UPDATE

The building projects at Jordan Elementary School and Jordan High School started in Spring and Summer 2024. Work is being completed through two phases, with final work being completed in Fall 2025. In Spring and Summer 2025, construction crews were able to complete the Jordan Elementary School 1970s renovation area including 13 classrooms, the media center, art room, RTI rooms, several special education classrooms, restrooms, the back drop off area (first lift), ELS and JES playgrounds, and a roof replacement on the 1970s section of the building. Crews were also

able to complete the seven classroom building addition that wasn't planned to be completed until Spring 2025. At Jordan High School, construction crews were able to complete the new secure entrance and front office space, as well as a full roof replacement. At the same time, the District was able to update the security technology in all exterior doors at Jordan High School.

The work at Jordan Elementary School will continue through the 2024-2025 school year, and is planned to be completed in Fall 2025. We are excited to continue to move into these spaces as they are completed and begin to use them with students and staff.

MIDDLE SCHOOL JMS has had a fantastic first half of the year. Each day the JMS staff greets approximately 600 students, inspiring them to create, design, and engage in meaningful learning. Grade level teams collaborate on interdisciplinary instruction in the areas of reading, language arts, science, social studies, and math with enrichment and intervention opportunities to meet students' individual needs. Diverse exploratory and elective courses at the middle school level provide an opportunity for students to find their individual gifts and talents. These courses capitalize on the curiosity of middle school level learners while exposing them to a wide range of topics in order to discover new ideas or skills they may not know they have. In order to maintain a safe and productive learning environment, we continually teach and reteach expectations through authentic scenarios so all members of our JMS community display Jordan PRIDE (Preparedness, Respect, Integrity, Dependability, and Excellence). We are excited to partner with families through open communication in order to support and equip our students for Jordan High School and beyond!

HIGH SCHOOL We have had a great start to the school year. Students have adjusted well to our phone policy implementation and are doing awesome! Our students have shown their Jordan PRIDE (**P**reparedness, **R**espect, Integrity, **D**ependability, **E**xcellence) in their daily actions. We are proud of the authentic learning experiences that students are getting daily at Jordan High School. In Creative Communications, students are learning about podcasts and developing their own podcast to be published based on their own interests. Our Healthcare and Medicine students are getting work experience with our partners at Oak Terrace Assisted Living, in our CNA Lab, and working with our athletic trainer. Students enrolled in Introduction to Education will be spending the month of December in classrooms assisting our teachers and teaching lessons. Building and Trades students spend time learning about and applying that knowledge to building small cabins.

Its purpose is to advise and advocate, not to decide policy. Local SEACs advise school districts on the development of programs and services to meet the special educational needs of children and families. The Jordan SEAC typically meets two to three times a year and meets remotely via Google Meet. Please consider sharing your experiences, expertise and knowledge with the Jordan SEAC.

SCHOOL SAFETY REMINDERS

The safety of all students and staff is one of our district's top priorities. Keeping our schools safe allows students to look forward to being in an encouraging environment that promotes social and creative learning. To help keep our entire school community safe, our district has safety practices in place to ensure the safety of our students and staff.



To help maintain these safety practices, we ask that all members of our entire school community assist us at our buildings by:

- Updating your Parent Portal account to ensure your student's medical information, parent contact information (phone numbers, emails, etc.), and emergency contacts are up-to-date.
- Entering school buildings through the secure visitor entrances, providing a photo ID as part of the visitor sign-in process, and wearing a visitor badge while in our school buildings.
- Following the school zone speed limit of 20 mph when children are present, using blinkers when turning in/out/around the school district campus, and yielding to pedestrians in crosswalks.
- Helping our schools ensure student safety and control the flow of traffic during pick-up/drop-off times by following the procedures that are outlined by each school building.

This clinic is for residents whose insurance does not pay for immunizations, and residents who do not have insurance. The immunization clinic does not replace well-child checkups or annual physicals. 
