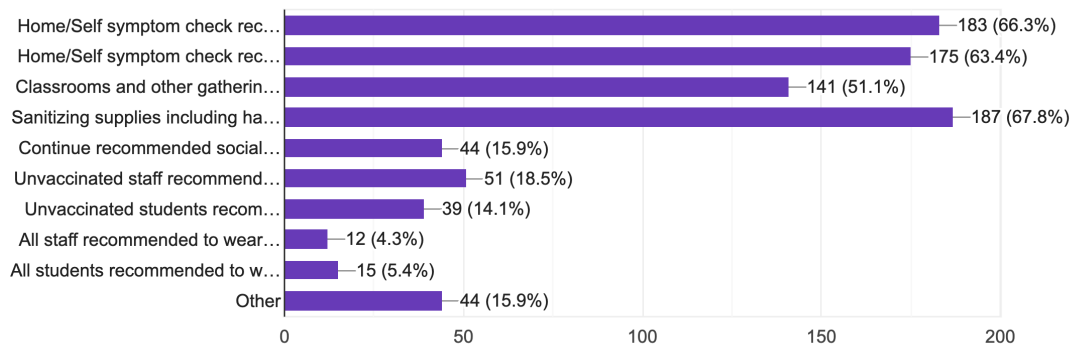


RESOURCES

The following data was collected as part of the public survey period. This includes local community data and Jordan Public Schools staff data. This data includes a synopsis of 284 responses and was used in planning for the 2021-2022 school year.

Regarding COVID-19 prevention, what safety measure(s) would you like Jordan Public Schools to prioritize for the 2021-2022 school year? (Select all that apply)

Results:

- Home/Self symptom check recommended for every staff member before entering the school/workplace - 66.3%
- Home/Self symptom check recommended for every student before entering school - 63.4%
- Classrooms and other gathering places continued heightened sanitization procedures - 51.1%
- Sanitizing supplies including hand sanitizers readily available to staff and students - 67.8%
- Continue recommended social distancing protocols when possible - 15.9%
- Unvaccinated staff recommended to wear a face mask/covering, not required except where MDE/MDH requires - 18.5%
- Unvaccinated students recommended to wear a face mask/covering, not required except where MDE/MDH requires - 14.1%
- All staff recommended to wear a face mask/covering, not required except where MDE/MDH requires - 4.3%
- All students recommended to wear a face mask/covering, not required except where MDE/MDH requires - 5.4%

Additional Comments:

- **No safety measures** should be taken - 17 similar comments
- Staff and students **should** wear masks - 8 similar comments
- Students and staff **should not** wear masks - 68 similar comments
- No mandatory quarantines - 4 similar comments
- Vaccines **should not** be required - 2 similar comments
- Vaccines **should** be required - 1 similar comment
- We would like a virtual option - 1 similar comment
- Enhanced cleaning and sanitization should remain - 6 similar comments
- All safety measures should remain - 2 similar comments
