What is included in the \$160 registration fee?

- Additional tournament fees are generally \$20 per angler per tournament to compete in the Lund Virtual Fishing League and Student Angler Tournament Trail (SATT).

High School Lettering

The team awards letters to student-athletes in grades 7-12 who exemplify what Scott West Fishing strives to teach. The Scott West Fishing Letter is awarded to people who consistently attend team meetings, competitions (must fish 3 out of 5 virtual and one in-person event, or 4 out of 5 virtual events), and at minimum one team volunteer event.

Additional criteria the coaches will take into consideration:

- Did you attend team meetings (without reminders from a coach)?
- Did you arrive at team meetings and events on time?
- If you missed a team meeting, did you let your coach know in advance?
- Did you have a positive attitude throughout the season?
- Were you a positive role model for the other members of the team?
- Were you ever unable to compete due to MSHSL rules violations?

Letters are awarded to their recipients at the end of the season.

What changed this year?

Students <u>must</u> attend at least one volunteer event to be eligible for Lettering.

Equipment

What do you need?

- Fishing pole (your choice)
- Tackle & lures (your choice, no live bait during tournaments)
- MN Fishing License required for ages 16+
- Tournament day: boat, boat safety equipment, boat captain, and co-angler*
- Parent/guardian support

What will the team supply?

- Bump board (will provide pending sponsorship donation; more info in appendix)
- Team jersey
- *Work with your coach if you need a boat, boat captain, and/or co-angler





Parents and Boat Captains

- Volunteers Needed! (boat captains, weigh-ins, etc.)
- League Rules expect everyone (including students) to read/now the, follow links from our website
- Boat Captains
 - Background checks
 - Your role as a boat captain...
- Boats Safety is #1!
 - Life jackets, motor kill switch, minimum insurance requirements
 - Operating live well with aeration system (in-person tournaments)
 - Other DNR, State, Coast-Guard, etc. regulations
 - Insurance (300k MNJB, reasonable liability limit SATT/Virtual)
 - Boat size (14' Virtual, 14' SATT, 16' MNJB); Max horsepower

Lund Virtual Fishing League

Tournament Details:

- Virtual statewide events (you pick the public lake); top 7 fish; 100-200+ teams
- \$40 per team per event
- Ages 5 to graduated senior in high school
- Catch-Record-Release format
- Fish from a boat, kayak, canoe or even shore
- If in boat, must have age 19+ adult boat captain
- Team is two anglers (2 students or 1 student with 1 adult)
- Trophies and gift cards/certificates for placing + random draw for Scheels gift cards at every event
- "Fall Fling" qualifier event with scholarship give away
- +\$50k in Scheels gift cards and +\$20k in scholarships



Student Angler Tournament Trail (SATT)

Tournament Details:

- Live statewide events with specified lake; top 7 fish;
 150+ boats
- \$40 per team per event + travel expenses
- Registration 6 weeks in advance of each event (note these fill up quickly)
- Entering grades 9-12, two anglers (2 students) plus a boat captain
- Mandatory rules meeting the evening prior to event
- Catch-Record-Release format
- Top teams qualify TOC and Nationals
- +\$50k in scholarships and +\$30k in returned fundraising dollars





MN Junior Bass (High School)

*Dates & Lakes are Tentative

Tournament Details:

- Greater Southwest Metro (Scott West, TCU, St. Peter, Lake Crystal, Waterville, Worthington)
- Entering grades 9-12, two anglers (2 students) plus a boat captain
- Live events; top 5 fish in live well; weigh-in after tournament;
 20-40 boats; coach submits roster
- No additional fees
- Trophies awarded to top finishers
- Fish all tournaments, top teams qualify for state and national events

What changed this year?

- Statewide conference
- Entering grades 3-8, two anglers (2 students) plus a boat captain
- Live events; top 5 fish in live well; weigh-in after tournament; 25 boats
- No additional fees
- Parents sign up for only one of the three events
- Trophies awarded to top finishers
- Each individual Junior Open will advance the top 15 place finishers to state championship; top teams from there eligible for nationals
- Great experience before high school!

Why Bass Fishing?

- Relatively new (1970s) compared to traditional sports (late 1800s)
- Established sport at the amateur and professional level
 - One of the fastest growing sports at college level and rising sport in high school
- Bass are widely available and can be caught almost anywhere. Anglers can use various lures and fishing techniques, and experiment with baits.
 - The most abundant freshwater fish in North America
- Beginner friendly sport, not difficult to catch (or are they...?)
- Bass are powerful, aggressive and excellent fighters!
- Relatively inexpensive and fun for all ages, life-long sport

Eligibility

Is there an age requirement? The Scott West Fishing Team is open to students ages 10 through 18.

Are there any prerequisites? Ages 16 and older must purchase a Minnesota fishing license. Please consult your state DNR regarding age requirements for fishing licenses and watercraft operator's certificates.

Is any experience required? Our team runs from Spring to Fall with team meetings, guest speakers, and opportunities to compete at both the junior and high school levels. Whether you're a beginner or an experienced angler, there's a place for you!

How does school athletic eligibility work? If you are a Jordan, or Belle Plaine Public Schools student living in the district, a student of the district through open enrollment, or home-schooled living in the district you are eligible for our team. If you are living in the district but are open enrolled in a school outside the district you must compete for that school if they have a team; if they do not have a team your eligibility reverts back to your district of residence. Students enrolled in Elevate Online through Southwest Metro 288 will be eligible to compete with the Scott West Fishing Team. Students enrolled in other online entities will not be able to participate on the team.

We will follow the MSHSL bylaws 205 and 206

- 205: No alcohol/controlled substances/etc. violations
- 206: Be a good person! (Cheating on a test, fighting anything that could cause you to be suspended or arrested)

Leadership Award

We encourage ALL student-athletes to be leaders on the team. To be recognized as a leader of the Scott West Fishing team a student-athlete must:

- Set a good example for other anglers
- Be a good communicator
- Make good decisions when representing Scott West Fishing Be Ethical
- Motivate and empower other anglers
- Be respectful of teammates, coaches, boat captains and nature
- Be dependable
